

What is ResearchMatch?





Key Definitions




- Researcher: The study contact who has been given access to use RM, either the Principal Investigator or the proxy for the PI
- **Liaison:** The institutional contact who reviews researcher access and requests in the RM system.
- Dashboard: The landing page for users after logging into the system.
 Researchers, liaisons, and volunteers all have dashboards.
- **Feasibility Access**: An access level that allows researchers to search aggregate registry information only. The researcher does not need to register an IRB approved study.
- Recruitment Access: An access level that allows researchers to use RM for contacting potential volunteers. The researcher must have an IRB approved study and an IRB approved contact message.



How ResearchMatch Works







PI Confirms Liaison Reviews





Researcher registers & adds IRB approved study

Researcher identifies volunteer pool









Volunteers make final choice to share their identifiable contact information with the researcher

RM sends Researcher's Contact Message to selected volunteers

Registering as a New User

- Click on "Register Now" and follow the prompts.
- · You must use your UGA email address.
- Complete the registration process in one sitting or the entered information will not be saved.
- Upon registration, you will receive an email with your verification code to complete the registration process and have final access to Your (Researcher) Dashboard in ResearchMatch.

NOTE: If your study does not have IRB approval yet, you will only have "feasibility access" which will allow you to assess the availability of volunteers that match your study's eligibility criteria. An IRB-approved study can be added later at any time.

Obtaining IRB Approval to Use ResearchMatch.org

To include ResearchMatch as a recruitment tool in your new or previously approved IRB research study, follow the instructions below:

- Complete the ResearchMatch Researcher Request Form (available from the <u>IRB Portal's Library</u>, under the "General" tab).
 - a) IMPORTANT: Before you proceed with completing this form, please note the types of studies that meet the criteria to use ResearchMatch as a recruiting tool. Only clinical, biomedical, translational and socio-behavioral research studies with health-related outcomes or focus are eligible to use ResearchMatch. Please note that ResearchMatch Program Manager (at Vanderbilt University) reserves the right to deny or disable a study that does not fit this criterion. If you have questions about the eligibility of your study, you may contact.

Review Criteria


1. Health related outcome or focus

2. Contact Message

- Does not include PI or study team's name, email, phone, or url that links to the PI's lab
- Not more than 2000 characters

In addition:

- Match the IRB Submission
- Written in a layperson's language
